Learn more about your options and enroll!

We are happy to announce that for this year's Covered California Open Enrollment period, ChapCare will have a certified enrollment counselor at the Altadena Library to help community members renew and sign-up for Covered California plans.

ChapCare was founded in 1995 by a group of community residents, city officials, and healthcare agencies to establish primary healthcare services for low-income, uninsured residents in Pasadena and Altadena.

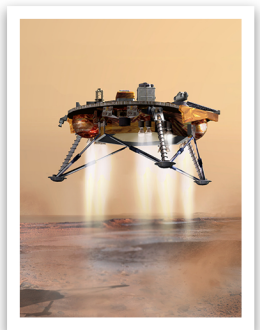
ChapCare began providing medical services in 1998 and dental services in 2001. Today, ChapCare is a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) that provides comprehensive healthcare services, including family medicine, women's health, pediatrics, dental, vision, behavioral health, pharmacy, and health insurance enrollment assistance.

The enrollment counselor will be at the Main Library from 5:00pm to 9:00pm on:

- Mondays, November 5th & 19th
- Mondays, December 3rd, 10th, & 17th

"Are you the sum total of your worst acts?" - Bryan Stevenson

There There is a novel with twelve different perspectives, twelve Native voices, through which Tommy Orange occupies every facet of the Native American exodus: what it is to be an Urban Indian, to reconcile with fractured identity. This is an allegorical look at the lived experience of urban Native Americans, set in present day Oakland, California. Centered around a powwow, this multigenerational story of so many flawed characters can be hard to follow. Our group nearly gave up, but we soldiered through it. The book was a tad scattered and confusing at times. There is a major climax at the end, however it felt disconnected from the characters. In summary there are brilliant standalone essays in this book but as a whole, the book is lacking. While filled with historical references and the struggles Native Americans continue to have, we still felt even after completing it that we were missing something...

How do you keep yourself motivated, entertained, inspired and positive and as you spend 30 years trying to prove your innocence as dozens of other men are executed by the state of Alabama? You start a book club, travel far away from the prison in your mind, and take up journaling. **The Sun Does Shine**, a memoir by Death Row inmate Anthony Roy Hinton was not an easy read, either. However, hope was always present from Hinton's steadfast mother, his remarkably devoted best friend, and his tenacious lawyer that fought for years to have Hinton's sentence overturned. This is a highly distressing look at how your life can be taken away due to bad judgment, poor representation, and abominable disrespect and laws. Read it!



A Big Thank You to Alex!

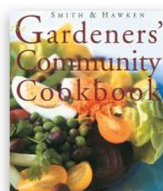
Altadena Library prides itself on the state-of-the-art technology it offers its patrons, and volunteers like Alex help our IT Manager keep systems running!
