When his younger brother Henry died he became interested in parapsychology. He recorded a number of personal experiences in telepathy, and an experience with an apparition which he had in Montreal. He briefly served on the Confederate side in the Civil War. For two weeks. He realized death and destruction were not for him. There are no direct descendants of this witty writer.

Circe by Madeline Miller: Circe, who is the daughter of the god of the sun, Helios, is more than a goddess. She is also a witch, capable of creating powerful spells that she can cast on both gods and mortals. As she is just becoming aware of her powers as a witch, she casts two spells that lead Zeus to banish her forever on the deserted island of Aiaia. And "forever" is a really, really long time for a goddess, since she will never die. While Circe is stuck here, she is not living her millennia in solitude. She has visitors! Lots of them. Some are good and some are evil, but none is boring. And the parade of mortals and gods who come to Aiaia is a supremely entertaining tour through the best of the myths. Unfortunately our book club did not enjoy this book choice, not finishing it.



TECHNOLOGY UPDATE RFID Prep in its Final Stages

If you have been to the Bob Lucas Branch or Main Library in recent months, it is likely that you have seen library staff pushing a trolley through the shelves, carefully tagging and scanning materials as they go. This detailed, deliberate

process is leading to the District's transition to using RFID technology for tracking and managing the collection. RFID, short for "Radio-Frequency Identification," will make the check-out process easier for patrons and will ensure more reliable management of the collection for staff. To ensure an accurate transition, Library staff has had to individually tag every item in the collection!



This new technology is scheduled to go live the first week of May. Until then, the new RFID check-out stations (pictured right) will start appearing at both locations. Training materials will be available for patrons before the transition is complete and staff will be prepared to help you with any of your questions about the new check-out process!






